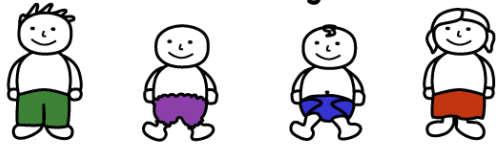
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Tell us the names and authors of 3 books you really liked reading and hearing:

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Tip: Board books are great for infants and toddlers: limited text for their short attention spans and sturdy pages to prevent damage from curious hands.

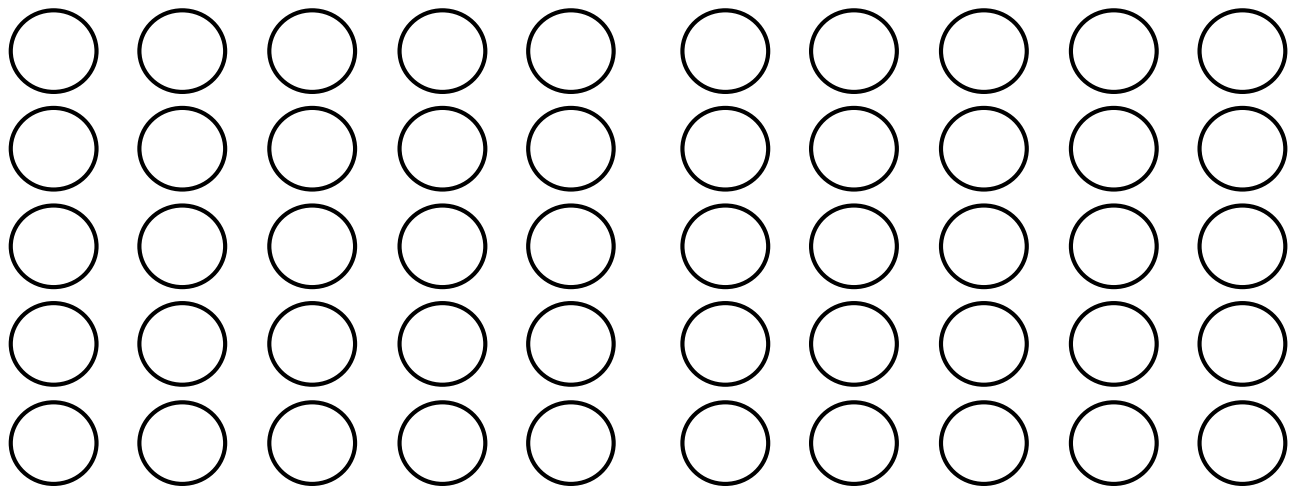
